## Release of Rights to Festival on the Neuse (BBQ Festival)

The Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of the Kinston-Lenoir County Chamber of Commerce met on Wednesday, November 13, 2019. The Committee unanimously voted to relinquish any rights to the BBQ Fest on the Neuse, to the Kinston-Lenoir County Tourism Development Authority.






